BLESSED TO BLESS OTHERS

As we take the journey to discover what God would have us do, we should keep in mind the "Three laws of God's Blessing":

- Our blessings should flow to others. The Bible teaches us that we are blessed, not just so that we can feel good, not just so we can be happy and comfortable, but so that we will bless others. God told Abraham in Genesis 12: "I will bless you and you will be a blessing to others." This is the first law of blessing it must flow outwardly.
- 2. Our blessings to others will come back on us. The more you bless other people and the more you help others, the more God blesses your life. Luke 6:38 tells us: "Give your life away and you'll find your life given back with blessing." You cannot out-give God."
- 3. The more we're blessed by God, the more He expects us to help others. Jesus said it this way in Luke 12: "Much is required from those to whom much is given. For their responsibility is greater."

WHILE LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

When our congregation stepped out in faith in 2003 to put needed facilities in place for ministry, our heart's desire was to honor God in all. That desire continues today as we celebrate God's blessings and look forward, in great faith, to the future God has for us. God's plan for us is clear. We are to reach out and make new disciples for the transformation of our families, homes, neighborhoods, communities, and world. We have visions and dreams for ministry beyond today which will enable us to reach our community in more effective ways.

VISIONS AND DREAMS ARE NOT ENOUGH

If we fall short of fulfilling our God-given mission, become complacent, or fail to be good stewards of the financial and non-financial resources God has entrusted to us, we will impede our ability to achieve God's plan and purpose for our lives and church.

OUR CURRENT FACILITY DEBT

Our church facilities are an extraordinary tool for ministry, valued at \$8,148,105.15.

- Total loan balance as of December 2014: \$2,546,991.82.
- Lender: Home Federal Bank.
- Current interest rate: 4% (set to change April 23, 2017, based on the weekly average yield on U. S. Treasury securities plus a margin of 3%; will not be less then 4% when renegotiated per agreement.)
- Average Monthly interest: \$8,976.46.
- Average Monthly principal: \$7,947.54.
- Date of final debt payment: Under present terms — October 23, 2032.

THREE REASONS WHY "FORWARD TO FREEDOM" IS CRUCIAL

1 KEEPS MINISTRY STRONG AND FOCUSED

Capital campaign gifts for paying down building debt assures the right proportion of our tithes and offering remains available for daily ministry. Our daily ministries "make a real difference in the lives of our neighbors and each other." Reducing our debt obligation will allow our ministries to grow.

2 FREES US TO TALK ABOUT THE FUTURE

When our debt is reduced to a more manageable level, we can begin serious conversation about other ministry opportunities God has prepared for us. We can once again dream God's dream for the future.

3 HONORS OUR INTENT

Our intent has always been to pay for our building with special gifts — above and beyond our tithes and offerings — rather than from our daily operational budget. Not only does this give us an opportunity to grow in the grace of giving, it also helps assure a healthy ministry environment.

God desires First Farragut UMC to be an intentional, vibrant, growing faith community transformed through prayer, scripture, worship, and study.

God wants us to make a real difference in the lives of our neighbors and each other as we **invite**, **accept**, **connect**, **serve**, **and share the love of Christ**.

PERSPECTIVE: IT'S ABOUT BEING THE CHURCH GOD IS EXPECTING US TO BE

Our past gifts toward the building have provided the primary funding source for our building obligations. The pledge period from our most recent campaign has ended. That is why it is so important for us to focus on our special gifts through "Forward to Freedom" this spring.

If it became necessary to pay our average principal (\$7,947.54 per month) strictly from our church's daily operating expenses, 40% of our church's daily ministry budget (\$286,111.44) would be redirected from operations to building payments over the next three years, crippling our daily ministry. Simply stated, our church could not be the church God is expecting us to be, nor the church we are today.

Life-changing ministries attract people and retain the families we have. God's blessings are evidenced in all we have accomplished. We are faithful, so let's come together in this important task of moving "forward to freedom" and honoring God every step of the way!

Because the average monthly interest of \$8,458 on our building loan is funded through our church budget, every dollar you give in the "Forward to Freedom" initiative is applied to the principal.

No one knows what the future holds, but for the sake of illustration, if we apply current interest rates and reduce our debt by \$1,000,000 with special gifts paid over the next three years, we would save more than \$425,000 in interest (resources which could be used for other ministry purposes), and our loan balance would be reduced to approximately \$1,600,000.



A Note from Rev. Amy R. Probst, Lead Pastor — First Farragut UMC:

It might seem that a church capital campaign has little to do with you and your day-to-day life. However, this past year we, as a congregation, worked long and hard -- praying, listening, and coming together to understand God's calling for First Farragut. We spent much of 2014 embracing our newly articulated vision statement; and I believe that if we listen now, we can hear God calling us to this next goal.

Moving "Forward to Freedom" is exactly what First Farragut needs. In order to live up to the vision that God has for us, we need to continue the good work of utilizing our financial resources and address freedom from the burden of debt.

What might it look like, and what might we be free to do, if we weren't concerned about budgeting the more than \$100,000 that we pay for interest on our existing loan? What dreams might we begin to dream again? What "transformation" might we see? What "real differences" might we be a part of?

I'm asking you to prayerfully consider being a part of this movement in whatever way you are able.
