IN THE BOAT

When Jesus borrowed Peter's boat to preach to the crowd, Peter was in the boat.

- Peter became INTERESTED in what Jesus had to say. "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch" (Luke 5:4b). "Simon answered, 'Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets" (Luke 5:5).
- All were astonished by the catch of fish and Peter was INSPIRED to follow Jesus. "Then Jesus said to Simon (Peter), 'Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people" (Luke 5:10).
- ◆ So Peter got INVOLVED and as he learned to follow Jesus, he watched with amazement while Jesus healed the sick and calmed the storms of life: So, the disciples got into a boat with Jesus and set out for the other side of the lake, a storm came and they felt they were in great danger. Jesus stopped the wind and the raging waters; the storm stopped, and all was calm_(luke 8:23-24).
- Peter's amazement turned to TRUST: Jesus came walking on the water.
 "Lord, if it's you,' Peter replied, 'tell me to come to you on the water.'
 'Come,' he (Jesus) said" (Matthew 14:28-29).
- ◆ TRUST grew to REVELATION and to Peter's confession of Christ: "But what about you?' he (Jesus) asked, 'Who do you say I am?' (Matthew 16:15).
- Peter realized he was IN THE PRESENCE of God. "Simon Peter answered,
 You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16).



Jonah was in a boat, too. He was using it to flee from the Lord. He was **NOT INTERESTED** in doing what God had asked of him. So, instead of being **IN THE BOAT**, he ended up **IN THE WATER**, and **IN THE FISH**.

Interestingly enough, Jesus used the "Sign of Jonah," 3 days and 3 nights in the belly of the fish, to describe his death, 3 days and 3 nights in the heart of the earth $_{\text{(Matthew 12:39)}}$.

Here is a bit of trivia: In Matthew 16:17 Jesus calls Peter, "Simon son of Jonah." Other times He calls him, "Simon son of John." The name Jonah means DOVE. That reminds me of another BOAT story: Noah and the Flood. "Then he sent out a DOVE to see if the water had receded..." (Gen 8:8) "...there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf!..." (Gen 8:11).—PEACE

When Jesus was arrested, Peter was afraid and he denied the Lord. "You are not one of this man's disciples too, are you?'...He replied, 'I am not" (John 18:17, 25-27). But, after His resurrection, Jesus reinstated Peter: "Again Jesus said, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?" (John 21:16a). And Peter went from LOVE to total INVESTMENT"... 'Feed my sheep" (John 21:17).

God gave Jonah a second chance, too, to prophesy; for the Lord wants the whole world to hear the message of his grace.
